Walking Routes

The Heritage Trail			
Description	Distance	Time	Grade
A walk back in time, taking in historical features of interest including: the ruins of Eglinton Castle, Tournament Bridge, Ice House and Dovecot. A sensory walk through varied habitats of riverside, plantation and ancient natural woodland. Look out for kingfishers or roe deer.	3.5km (2.2 m) Equivalent to a walk along Saltcoats promenade	45 mins	Easy. Some paths hard standing, others are dirt tracks.

The Corsehill Circuit			
Description	Distance	Time	Grade
This is an all-level path but the suspension bridge will put a bounce in your step! On this route, you may see remnants of an age-gone by: original stone bridge, entrance to the old stable block, disused railway tunnel, Tournament Bridge and the ruins of Eglinton Castle. Woodlands, river and farmland habitats give opportunity to see heron, buzzards, and even salmon.	5.5km (3.5 m) Equivalent to walking from Eglinton Park to Irvine Beach Park	1 hr 15 mins	Moderate. Level throughout, mostly hard standing with some dirt paths.

Cairnmount View			
Description	Distance	Time	Grade
A walk around the Loch, alongside farmland, wetland meadows, broadleaved and conifer plantation. Passing through the local nature reserve managed by Scottish Wildlife Trust (SWT), this walk will take you up to the Cairnmount Standing Stones which will reward you with views of Arran and surrounding countryside.	6.5km (4 m) Equivalent to a walk around Cumbrae	1 hr 45 mins	Moderate to challenging. Mainly hard standing but with some hills.
